- Continue to advance research and convey evidence






- Absence of pregnant crash test dummies: motor vehicle crashes are leading cause of fetal death

Actions Stemming from Gender Summits & Related Initiatives

- Implementation of Gender Equity Action Plans
 - Shift focus from « track record » to « research opportunity » (GRC)
- SGBA considerations in the research content
 - Extrapolation of the results to the population as a whole, when they actually only apply to a portion of the population, is misleading and could have serious implications (Irish Research Council)
- Going Global
 - Participation in EU Network GenderNet http://www.gender-net.eu/
 - Involvement in the Gender Summit community
 - GRC included « Equality and Status of Women in Research » as one of two main topics at 2016 meeting
 - Participation of Quebec in the Unesco SAGA program
